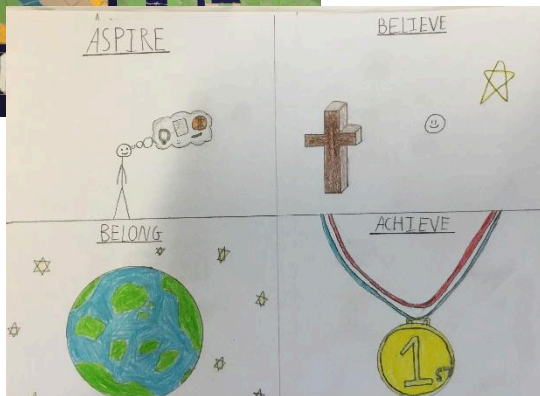

Creativity continued through artwork, where pupils explored visually how they shine. Each piece was as individual as the child who created it, yet together they told a powerful collective story.

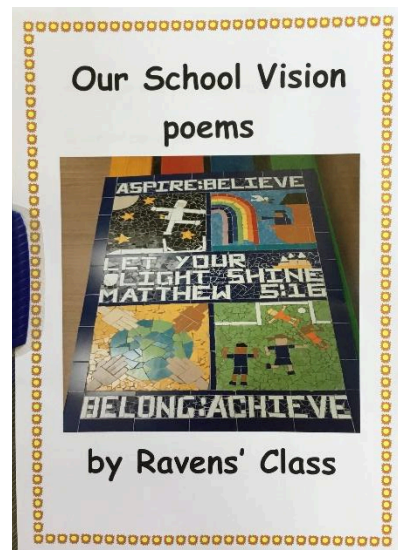
